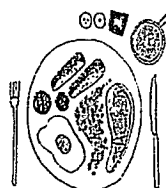

The parish council met on Monday, January 19th. Prior to the meeting, Joe Frost, from Gigaclear, gave a presentation to the council on the possible provision of superfast broadband. As a consequence, it is anticipated there will be a public meeting in late February /early March where more detailed information will be made available.

The council agreed to the setting of next year's precept of £12,010. This will see no increase in the parish council proportion of the council tax charge paid by villagers in the coming year.

Following removal of the two seriously infected lime trees from the green, pollarding work will be taking place on three of the remaining four trees. The trees are also being routinely checked for evidence of infection.

To help with parking issues, the council has agreed to an advisory white line on the road between the Old Fox and Back Lane. We have also agreed to the word SLOW being painted on Old Road by The Green.

The issue of litter was also raised and so we ask that villagers continue to help to keep Scaldwell as litter free as possible.

The next council meeting is scheduled for Wednesday March 18th in the Village Hall. All parishioners are welcome to attend.
