PARISH COUNCIL BY-ELECTION - THURSDAY, 16TH JUNE

Voting will take place at the Village Hall from 8 a.m. till 9 p.m. (The time is subject to confirmation at present, but is shorter than for the General Election a week earlier).

Following the resignations of Bert Coleman, Pauline Duff and Ken Hudson, all of whom deserve our thanks for their work on the Parish Council over a number of years, we are indeed fortunate in having no fewer than 9 candidates to fill the 3 vacancies until the whole Council comes up for election in 1984. PARISH COUNCIL

Matters dealt with at the May meeting included:-

Home Farm Development - Following strong representations from our Parish Council to ensure that the new house was built to conform with planning requirements, there had been 3 site meetings. As a result the roof will be of Welsh slate, the boundary wall will be capped dog-tooth style and the builder has been ordered to reconstruct the stonework of the front elevation in courses similar to adjoining houses. Daventry Planning Committee seem prepared to compromise on this requirement, which we feel is essential.
