AT THE RECENT MEETING of the Parish Council the recommendations of the Local Government Commissioners for the re-organisation of local government were discussed. The PC felt that the case for the change had not been adequately made out, and supported firstly the suggestions that no change should be made to the present system.

If this was not to be, then the PC felt that the third proposal of the Commissioners was preferable to the other two, ie that Northampton itself should become a new unitary authority while the rest of the county kept its present two-tier system.

On planning matters, the Council raised no objection to the application for a change of use for the studio in Back Lane to residential purposes.
