There have been several changes within Daventry District Council's planning procedures, and in order to reduce costs, they are no longer obliged to send out Notices of Planning Applications to all neighbouring properties, although they endeavour to do so, and will continue to place a yellow Notice as close to the property as possible. However, we would encourage all parishioners to check either the Parish Council website or the Notice Board on the bus shelter as we display all Planning Applications .

Could we please ask all villagers to respect the speed limit within the village as there have been several instances reported recently of cars pulling out of side streets at dangerous speeds. We would urge you to please drive with care and consideration of others.

We shall be participating once again in the Xmas tree re-cycling scheme and will place a Notice on the bus shelter as soon as Daventry have given us the deadline for the collection in January. All trees should be left on the village green behind the bus shelter as usual.

With the current outbreak of Ash Tree dieback disease our qualified tree warden Dylan Lewis has offered to advise anyone who has concerns to contact him on 882718.

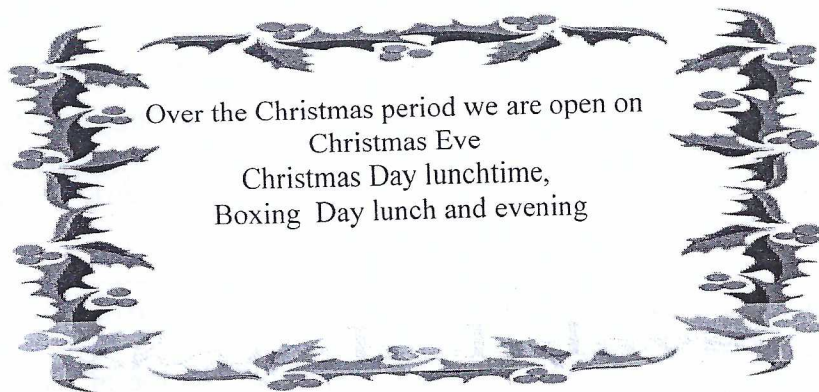
## News from Scaldwell Club

**The email reads:**

*ASDA is currently giving away ASDA shopping Gift Card!*

*You could be one of the winners. We are giving way cards in value from £50 to, unbelievable 1000.*

*All you have to do is click here and apply for our gift card.*

*If you win a gift we will mail it to your home address or call you by phone to arrange presenting the award in one of our stores. Best of luck. Your's ASDA Direct*

The supermarket issued a warning, saying: "Please be aware this email has not been published by Asda. We would encourage you not to follow the link or forward the mail on."
