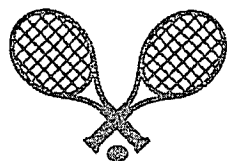

It was also confirmed that Council has made a formal submission to DDC requesting a precept of £13,081 for 2019-20.

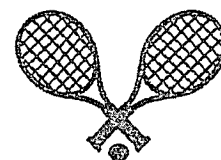
At this meeting, a concerned parishioner raised the issue of 5G rollout and its possible consequences. If you wish further information on this, please contact Adam
