Court Update - I am sure many of you have visited the court in the last few weeks, but for those of you who haven't I am pleased to report that the surface has been laid, the fencing erected and we are now waiting for temporary lines to be marked and the net and posts to be fixed. Although the court can then be used, but only for gentle tennis(!), the contractors advise us that it must be treated with great respect in the initial months before the final all-weather Tennitex surface is sprayed on. This interim period is critical to prevent any damage being sustained, thereby lengthening the life of the surface and ensuring the validity of our guarantee. The surface has to dry out and harden - during warm weather softening will occur causing major damage if played on. Under no circumstances should it then be used.

Obviously, this means there will be some days when play would be ill-advised and during such conditions, at the discretion of the Committee, the court will be closed. When the final covering has been applied, we can then extend the facility to encompass other sports, hopefully for the summer holidays. It must be stressed that these conditions have been imposed by the contractors and we look to parents particularly to inform their children.

Thank you to all who have responded so promptly to our letter inviting playing membership; your membership card, together with a copy of the rules and regulations, will follow shortly.

On April 21st at 7.30 p.m., we have planned a very informal Opening Ceremony on the Tennis Court to mark the realization of our

project. We look forward to seeing you all then.
