As a Christian minister, it is important to me that the church, and through the church the Christian Gospel, is accessible to the whole community. I think it is really good, therefore, to live in a community where the churches can be left open during the day for people to come in to pray, or just to sit. I also think it is important that there is a regular act of worship in each church, so that everyone knows when they can come together to worship God and to share in Christian fellowship.

To this end we have agreed a service pattern across the four churches in the Walgrave Benefice, with a service in each community, normally on the first three Sundays of each month, with a joint 'Benefice Service', normally at 10.00 am on the last Sunday of the month. The service pattern is as follows: Scaldwell: 11.00 am; Walgrave: 9.30 am; Old: 6.00 pm; Hannington: 11.00 am. See above for the full service details for June and July in Scaldwell.

On Monday 29<sup>th</sup> April, council met to consider planning application DA/2018/0251-Extension at 2, Old Road. No objection was raised but our comments were sent to DDC.

On Wednesday, 8<sup>th</sup> May, council held the Annual Parish Meeting (APM) at 7 pm and the Annual Parish Council Meeting (APC) at 7.45 pm.

We were disappointed at the low turnout as this is an opportunity for residents to raise any matter relating to their local community, however Council wishes to thank all who did attend and for the detailed reports submitted at the APM meeting from the various clubs/organisations within the village. Once again, the issue of traffic was raised, with council agreeing to continue looking at all possible solutions.

At the APC Meeting, Cllr O'Leary was elected as chairman for another year and Cllr Cross was elected as Deputy Chair.

Also, council reviewed and approved the various actions covering Scaldwell Council's annual audit report and annual governance statement

It is anticipated that the installation of new streetlights will be completed in the next few weeks.

The village Green repairs are almost complete and hopefully the placing of the new posts will help preserve it. The next Parish Council meeting will be held at 7.30pm in the Village Hall on Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> June 2019. All parishioners are most welcome to attend.

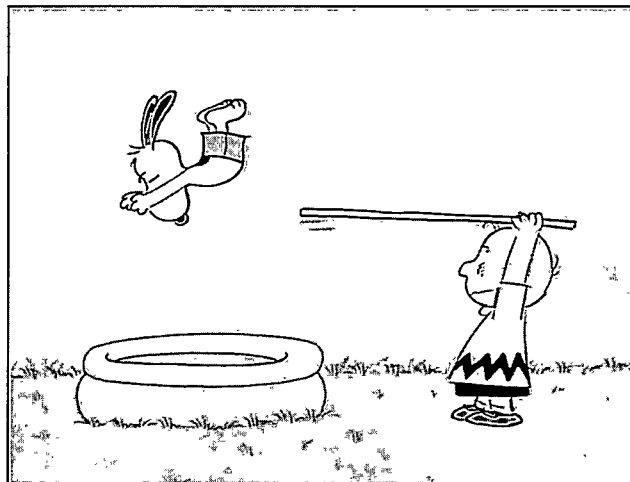

## **Chairman's Annual Report. May 2019**

This is my fifth annual report as Chairman of Scaldwell Parish Council. The role of the council is to represent the needs of the village and to seek to improve the quality of village life. My report is a summary of the council's activities during this past year, but should you wish to learn more about the role and work of the Council, further details may be found on the village website.

### **Meetings and general activities**

The Council held 9 statutory meetings during the year including the Annual Parish Meeting. In addition, we held a number of extraordinary meetings throughout the year to consider various planning applications. All our meetings are held in the Village Hall and we welcome all parishioners to attend. We always provide an opportunity for questions, concerns or comments to be raised.

We are very grateful to our District Councillors, Cllr Fabienne Fraser-Allen and Cllr Kevin Parker who attend meetings whenever they are able and are a vital link for us with the District Council. At a county level, we extend our gratitude to our County Councillor, Cecile Irving-Swift.

As stated in my report of May 2018, we were in the process of appointing a new clerk. I am very pleased to say that we have appointed Hayley Cawthorne as our new Clerk, who has quickly and most efficiently settled into her new role. On behalf of Council, I would like to express our thanks to Hayley for her commitment to the council

Over this past year, the three main projects undertaken by council have progressed at various stages. Due to the hard work of Councillor Purcell, the much awaited updating of the street lightning will, at the time of writing this report, have started. Also, work to repair and protect the Green has already started. On behalf of Council, I would like to thank councillors Purcell and Cross for all the work they have put into these projects. Work to install a defibrillator in the phone box is, however, taking a little longer than we thought due to unforeseen delays. It is hoped that the defibrillator will be in place later this year.

During the year, Cllr Wharton initiated a new WhatsApp page for residents to sign up to. It is anticipated that this will enable a quicker and more comprehensive monitoring and reporting of incidents/news in relation to the village's Neighbourhood Watch Scheme.

In the coming year, 2019/20, one of the key objectives of Council is to initiate a series of enhancements / repairs to the playing field.

Members of the Council continue to liaise with the county Highways Department looking at possible and realistic solutions to the problems faced by increased traffic flow and inconsiderate and at times dangerous driving through the village.

The council continues to stay abreast of developments within Brixworth regarding further planning developments.

### **Playing Field**

Our close working relationship with the 'Friends of the Playing Field' group continues to thrive ensuring the playing field remains well kept and maintained for the benefit of all. A very big thank you to all those villagers who devote so much of their time to the upkeep of the playing field and for their very successful fundraising efforts. The council is sincerely grateful to all who help at the playing field.

### **Membership and representation**

The council remains a member of the National and County Association of Local Councils and our Clerks have been members of the Society of Local Council Clerks. These organisations offer help and support to Clerks and Councillors and are invaluable in keeping us up to date with developments and legislation. As a village with a conservation area and with increasing development within the County, we are also members of CPRE (Campaign to Protect Rural England) and ACRE (Action with Communities in Rural England). We also have representation on the Village Hall Committee, the Parish Trust, the Relief in Need Charity, the Thomas Roe Foundation and Neighbourhood Watch.

**Finally** – I would like to thank my fellow Councilors for all their hard work during the past year and especially to Phil Purcell, our Vice Chair, for all his support and commitment.
