The Parish Council has met on two occasions since the last Newsletter, the last meeting being the Annual Meeting at the start of May - held on the same evening as the Annual Parish Meeting.

At the Annual Parish Meeting reports were submitted from all the Clubs and Society's within the village. The reports serve as a reminder of the true sense of community within the village.

The meeting was also attended by Police Constable's Tythe and Martin. PC Josh Tythe gave an update to all in attendance to the effect that policing in the area had been increased to include himself, PC Martin and three PCSO's.

PC Tythe confirmed that crime and anti-social behaviour in the area was minimal but urged all to remain vigilant as minor thefts from vehicles, caravans and of agricultural plant have increased and recently residential burglaries in Spratton and Moulton had been experienced.

Amongst other topics discussed were fly-tipping, especially on Mill Lane and speeding in the village. PC Tythe was requested to investigate visits of the speed camera van within the village.

Liberal Democrat Councillor Jonathan Harris attended the May meeting and provided an update in respect of event within the new Unitary Authority. Councillor Harris commented upon revised council boundaries which will result in a reduction in the future number of councillors, the housing strategy consultation and special needs school places.

Councillor Harris provided further information in respect of the Authority's ambition to achieve net zero carbon by 2030, the new Highways Maintenance contract, Homes for Ukrainian families, Community Transport and advice for those seeking a Council Tax rebate.

In other matters, the long awaited digital speed sign has now been delivered and will be erected shortly. The sign is permitted by the Police to be sited in three separate locations within the village and the intention is to periodically relocate the sign to avoid any speedsters from becoming overly familiar with the sign's location.

Following the previous installation of the defibrillator within the former telephone kiosk on the green, a training evening was held on 12<sup>th</sup> May. The evening was well attended and whilst we all hope that there will never be a requirement to use the defibrillator, familiarity with the operation of the facility has to be a good thing.

**Help Required.** As you will have read in the Parish Council article, the digital speed sign has now been delivered. Once it has been set up it is quite easy and straightforward to run but to make full use of the camera, help is required in maintaining the camera efficiently. Celebration is at the heart of the Christian Faith, not just at Christmas and Easter, but also in stories like the returning prodigal son who came home to a celebration laid on for him by his father, and in the image of heaven, often portrayed as a banquet. Jesus too celebrated with friends and family, not least at the wedding where he turned the water into wine!

Jubilee too has roots in the bible. In the Old Testament a 'Jubilee Celebration' was declared every fifty years and was marked by the cancelling of debts and by the freeing of slaves.

In celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, we recognise the example she has been to us for seventy years as head of both the nation and the Church of England.

We recognise her faithfulness to her Christian beliefs, her service to her people and her concern for the environment. Now, as we move into the summer months and hopefully away from the shadow of Covid, it is good to have something positive to celebrate, not just in our homes, but in our communities and across the nation.

When there is so much negativity in the news and the situation in Ukraine and Russia causes much suffering there and impacts our lives here, it is good to give thanks to God for the many things that we have to celebrate.

And, while we celebrate, let us not forget those weighed down by the ravages of war, by spiralling debts and by modern-day slavery, and let us pray and work together, so that they may know the freedom of their own Jubilee.
