Annual Sponsored Ride and Stride - 14th September 2013

This event is organised by the Northampton Historic Churches Trust and is used to fund the grants given to churches throughout the County. They have supported our grant applications on a number of occasions and do outstanding work in preserving the Churches in our communities here in Northamptonshire. Last year over £32,000 was raised by this event, which is an increase of 7% on the 2011 figure. Over 330 churches were open and 435 people rode or strode between them and from this and other funds the Trust has so far made grants of £44,000 to churches in Northamptonshire.

This annual event also provides an opportunity to raise money for your church, play your part in helping to preserve the heritage of churches in Northamptonshire and to enjoy the fellowship of other riders and striders.

Plan your own route from church to church; over 350 churches and chapels in Northamptonshire will be open to visit with a warm welcome and refreshments at many. All sponsorship money received will be divided equally between the NHCT and the church or chapel chosen by the participant.

We would like to thank Georgina Carter for agreeing to organise the rota of the 'Friends of the Playing Field'. This wonderful village amenity that we now have does require maintenance and we would encourage anyone who is spending time at the playing field to take a turn and help out - if you are there with your children why not take a trowel and do a little gardening at the same time? We should report that we have had a problem with cats using the sand pit to relieve themselves! Please would parents be aware that there is a hygiene issue and they should keep a watch on toddlers using the sand pit. The sand pit is checked and if necessary cleaned out on a weekly basis, but parents should be aware of the potential health and safety risk. In order to combat the problem we have installed an ultrasonic cat scarer - this is located on the side of the sand pit and should not be touched.

The next meeting of the Parish Council is on September 18th, 2013 at 7.30 pm in the Village Hall - we welcome all parishioners to attend. If you have any concerns or questions for the Councillors there is an opportunity to raise them during the meeting.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Children's safety is the Number One concern for all parents, and increasingly that includes keeping them safe in their digital world... In other words on the internet, texting and anything else they do online.

Many parents are finding out that their children know more than they do when it comes to computers and mobile devices, and understandably, some find that hard to admit. Combine that with children's natural curiosity and the unregulated internet, and many parents feel less than adequately equipped to guide their children in the right direction.

That's why in September, Get Safe Online will be launching its 'Switched On' campaign, aimed at parents who feel they need to know more about the subject (and let's face it ... who doesn't?). The campaign will recommend the best approach to advising and guiding children about what's right and what's not, and suggest some of the technology steps parents can put in place to keep checks on their online activity. It's about being a 'switched on' parent equipped to engage effectively with children on online safety.

The expert advice is being put together and circulated with the help of Get Safe Online partners Neighbourhood Watch and Symantec.

DACT has over 115 volunteer car drivers across the Daventry District assisting anyone who has difficulty using public transport to get to any medical appointments

What appointments do we cover?

Basically any medical appointment, including:-

- GP Practices • Hospitals • Dentists • Opticians • Health Centre

What area do we cover? Our drivers will take passengers to wherever their appointment may be. Although most appointments will be for GP Practices/Hospitals in Northamptonshire our drivers also travel on a regular basis to hospitals in other counties, such as Oxford, Birmingham, Coventry and sometimes even to London

What does it cost?

Our drivers are all volunteers and use their own cars. So, although they are not paid for their services we do levy a small charge for all car journeys, to cover the cost of fuel and general wear and tear of their vehicles.

Please phone for advice on the cost of your particular journey.

How does it work?

Typically drivers will pick you up in good time to meet your appointment time. You will be dropped off as close as possible to the required address/department. The driver will provide wheelchair assistance where required. As a guideline the driver will wait on-site or close by until you are ready to return home, unless the waiting time is likely to be for a prolonged period. If the time is prolonged the DACT Office should be informed and they will advise accordingly, but in most cases the driver will take you and wait to take you on your return journey. All our volunteer drivers are dedicated to ensuring that our passengers are given whatever support they need to make their trips as free of stress as possible.
