The annual inspection on the playing field equipment has now been completed. The report was generally good, but one or two minor repairs need to be done. These will be dealt with in the next week or two. The playing field itself has been cut and should provide a suitable surface for ball games.

Ward Action Service Plan (WASP)

At a recent consultative meeting of WASP which I attended in Brixworth, various topics were discussed.

A feed-back meeting was held on 13th September. Some criticisms were made of the timings of the meetings and the fact that many residents in the Ward had not received notification of the first meeting, or had received it too late. Daventry District Council apologised for this, but felt that they needed to promote the scheme fairly soon so that it could be put into operation next year. They hope to produce a draft plan by Christmas when options will be made known. There will be a small amount of money for each WARD in the district for which people (via the Parish Council or individual groups) can apply.

I hope to be able to give more information by Christmas.

Refuse Collection

Some people are not too happy with the fortnightly collection of the grey bins. There will be a consultation form in the magazine 'Daventry Calling' later this year where views

can be aired. The recycling initiative, however, involving red and blue boxes and the brown bins seems to have been very successful.

SCALDWELL PARISH TRUST AND SCALDWELL RELIEF IN NEED CHARITY

There will be a meeting of the Trustees of these charities on 9th November 1999 and applications for grants will be considered then.

The Trustees of the Parish Trust may apply the income of the trust 'as they think fit for any charitable purpose for the general benefit of the inhabitants of Scaldwell'. The income of the Relief in Need Charity is to be applied to the relief in need of persons resident in the parish by making grants of money or by paying for items or services.

Please will all those wishing to apply for grants falling within these objects submit their

applications to me before the end of October. All applications to the Relief in Need Charity will be kept confidential to the Trustees.

In the past because few applications have been made to the Relief in Need Charity the Trustees have been able to make a small Christmas grant to all pensioners resident in the parish. If you qualify for such a grant or know of someone who does please let me or one of the Trustees know. Anyone who has received such a grant in previous years will automatically be included again (if the Trustees decide to make a grant this year) and need not register their interest specifically.

ALLOTMENTS

At the meeting in November the Trustees will also consider whether they should increase rents for the allotments. These have been fixed for a number of years and currently stand at between £2 and £4 per year. Details of any increase will be given to allotment holders with the requests for payment at the end of the year. If anyone has decided to relinquish their allotment at the end of the year I would be grateful for some prior notice so that I can offer any vacancies to new applicants. If anyone wishes to take over an allotment from the end of the year please contact me for details.
