PARISH COUNCIL - Alison Goodenough

The next meeting of the Parish Council should be held on Wednesday 7th October and I shall be putting up the necessary notices over the next few days.

The summer has been fairly quiet for the Parish Council with few controversial matters. The Council agreed to oppose an application for an extension of time to 1997 for the Brixworth Tip and a site meeting was held to discuss this and other objections. We are awaiting the outcome of the County Council's decision.

An application for Listed Building Consent for internal works and alterations at Scaldwell House was not opposed by the Parish Council but no decision has yet been received.

No doubt other items of general interest will arise at the forthcoming meeting and I will report on them at a later date.

1993/4 REGISTER OF ELECTORS

The qualifying date for this register is 10th October 1992. Your name should appear on the parish register for the address at which you normally live. It doesn't matter if you are away on holiday, or on business on that date, as long as that is your main home.

A brown and white form, address to the Occupier, is sent to every property in the district. To make sure that you are going to be able to vote at any elections held between 16th February 1993 and 15th February 1994, you should make sure that all the names of people who are eligible to vote are included on the form.

The form is already addressed to 'Daventry District Council', and you do not need to put a stamp on it.

Even if you think you will move house shortly after 10th October, you should complete the form before you move, as you will not be eligible for your new address. Anyone who moves house during the life of the register still

the right to vote as long as they are on a register somewhere.

A draft register is published on 28th November each year. It is sent to all clerks to Parish Councils and Chairmen of Parish Meetings. It also goes to all District Councillors and local post offices.

Copies are also on display in Daventry at the Council Offices, the Main Post Office in Sheaf Street and the Library. All other libraries in the District also have copies.

YOU SHOULD CHECK TO MAKE SURE THAT YOUR NAME IS SHOWN ON THIS REGISTER.

If it is not, or you have queries, you can ring the Electoral Registration Dept. at Daventry District Council on 0327 71100.

Remember, if your name is not on the register when any sort of election or referendum is call, you will not be able to vote.
