 We have held twelve meetings this year, many of which have been concerned with planning applications. Most of these have been for small-scale projects and, therefore, not particularly controversial.

However, a recent application for building on land stretching from Old Road to School Lane has given more cause for concern, as part of the site had not been previously built on. This application has now been placed with

Davertry Planning Committee who, we believe, intend to visit the site. There is a feeling in the village that we should try to preserve our open spaces as much as possible in order to protect the form, character and setting of the village.

We are also concerned that there are few houses left in the village suitable for first time buyers and that young people wishing to stay in the village are not able to do so.

(Since the Report, the application referred to above has been amended. Part of the site which had given cause for concern, has now been withdrawn from the application.)

Roads

After a long delay the various potholes etc. in all areas of the village were repaired. This was not quite the major repair which was promised but lack of funds plus the excessive rainfall during the previous Winter were given as reasons for the late and limited work done.

The erosion of the Green continues to be a problem. The parts worst affected, ironically are next to wide areas of road. We are in the process of looking at ways to prevent further destruction.

The grass-cutting has now started for the new season and a general tidying up of the Green, including a clearing of the paths, has now been completed. The playing field is cut occasionally but moles are making this rather difficult

Playing Field

The Royal Society for the prevention of Accidents will carry out its annual inspection of the Playing Field and Play area in June. Following on from the last inspection, some general repairs have been carried out, including the removal of the goal posts which were loose, badly rusted and therefore not safe. The area around the play equipment is regularly trimmed. A new slide was purchased to replace the old one which was worn out.

Budget

Grass-cutting will see a small increase this year. This is quite an expense but the village does have several areas of green to be maintained. As a result of a recent maintenance report by ABB Services and

Solutions, one street lamp has had to be replaced.

A new bench has been erected on the Green and we thought it fitting to inscribe it with Nick's name as he had done so much for the village over the years.

Our finances continue to be sound, and I would like to thank Stan Turner, our clerk, for his work in drawing up our financial reports and for presenting our accounts to the auditor.

Finally I would like to thank all the councillors and Stan for their support during the year. It is greatly appreciated.
