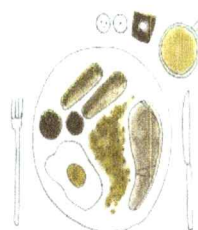

The Parish Council met on Wednesday 18th November. Among the issues discussed was the recent visit of the local Police Commissioner to the village. He made a number of suggestions regarding traffic control in the village which we will now be looking in to

The Parish Council Broadband Working Party have arranged a meeting with Gigaclear for the 25th November where we hope to receive an update on progress as well as discuss the placing of their cabinet. For further information regarding Gigaclear you may visit their website www.gigaclear.com

As you might have noticed, much needed work has been done to trees on the Green and the Parish Council would like to offer a big vote of thanks to Dylan Lewis and Geoff Gardner for undertaking this task.

The council agreed a new policy on risk assessment and the setting up of a Highways Working Party. The working party will be following up on the traffic control suggestions made by the Police Commissioner and will also look into speeding and parking in the village.

The white line painted outside the Old Fox on the High street goes further up the High Street than originally agreed and is scheduled in the county highways work programme for correction. In the meantime, if there are any concerns regarding parking then please contact one of the councillors.

Councillors have received concerns from a number of parishioners regarding dogs barking, particularly during the night, as well as an increase in dog mess round the village. May we ask dog owners to help us in dealing with these issues.

Leftover Turkey Casserole

Ingredients (Serves 4)

2 onions, finely chopped
1 eating apple, cored and chopped
2 tbsp olive oil
1 tsp dried sage, or 5 sage leaves, chopped
2 tbsp plain flour
300ml vegetable or chicken stock
2 tbsp wholegrain mustard
2 tbsp runny honey
400g-500g leftover turkey, shredded
About 350g leftover roasted vegetables

Method

Fry the onion and apple in the oil until softened in a casserole or deep pan. Stir in the sage for 1 min, and then stir in the flour. Gradually stir in the stock followed by the mustard and honey. Bring up to a simmer and stir in the turkey and roast veg. Cover and gently simmer for 15 mins until turkey is piping hot. Season and eat with mash or jacket potatoes.
