The Parish council met on Wednesday 18th September where Dara Masterson-Jones was co-opted on to the council to replace Phil Purcell.

Council discussed a petition brought forward by a number of Scaldwell residents concerning the relocation of the Domesday Plaque and the WW1 memorial plaque, both of which are positioned on the former well wall on the village green.

It was resolved that Sue Dodds-Smith and Nick Masterson-Jones would research funding avenues for repair works to be carried out on the wall and well and at the same time to consider repositioning the 100-year WW1 anniversary memorial plaque elsewhere on The Green. Nick Masterson-Jones also agreed to undertake the repositioning of the Domesday plaque.
