It was noted at the June meeting that the Jubilee celebration had been a memorable and most enjoyable weekend. Thanks must go to the Club and Jubilee committee who worked so hard to produce a full weekend of activities and ensured that a good time was had by all.

A letter from West Northamptonshire Council has been received granting consent to fell the unsafe Cedar tree on the Green and it was agreed that this would be undertaken in October after the bird nesting season. The Parish Council agreed to plant a replacement tree with the variety to be decided at a later date.

The Council is in the process of requesting tenders for the Village Green grass cutting work and it was agreed that the contract would remain with the existing company until such time as quotes are received.

It was agreed that the Parish Council would instruct a broker, Utility Aid, to compare energy prices.

The planning appeal for construction of detached double garage in East End was noted by the Council.

At the July meeting Unitary Councillor, Kevin Parker, reported that covid cases were rising in the county and that a mobile vaccination unit was visiting Brixworth in July.

Cllr Long reported on the recent Police Liaison meeting she had attended.

An Officer from WNC met with a group of Parish Councillors and volunteers on Thursday, 7th July to help with the installation of the Speed Display Sign. Thanks must go to Brian Hardie, Tom Joyner, Martin Davies, Rob Dalziel, Paul Carter, Chris Riseley and Darren Dean for volunteering to charge and change the batteries on a fortnightly rota. Special thanks go to Brian Hardie who has also taken the associated App under his wing and is supplying the Parish Council with detailed data on traffic passing through our village. On preliminary evidence it does look as if the monitor is having a good effect and reducing the speed of the traffic. Also, thanks to Martin Howard for his help in installing the monitor. Please be aware that it is possible for the monitor to work on a "spy" mode which means that the speed display is not illuminated. It is still working but this allows us to check the effect the monitor has when in full display mode.

Two Planning Applications were considered by the Council for The Rectory Farmhouse, High Street and The Old Fox, High Street.

Cllr Monk provided a report and quotes for new items of play equipment and repairs needed to the play area and entrance. It was resolved to proceed with work to the entrance and repairs to the bench.

Dear neighbours and friends,

As of September, I would like to go into catering from home and sell French home-made traditional cuisine. Below is an extensive list of meals which can be prepared and frozen in advance with a request of, at least, 3 days' notice prior to local delivery.

My first objective is to establish whether or not there would be some local interest in this potential venture. Just to give you a guideline on price, I estimate/target £10-12 for Category 1 dishes (2 people); £5-6 for Category 2 dishes (2 people) and £5-6 for Category 3 dishes (2 people). However, these prices are subject to review, depending on variation in cost of some ingredients. I would be catering in generous portions for 1 and 2 people. All meats will be sourced from reputable local butchers and cooked using the best ingredients, including home-made stocks.

Below is a small survey and I would be most grateful if you would highlight your **Top 5 dishes in each category**. For your information, I currently hold a City & Guild Level 2 – Food Safety and Hygiene for Catering Certificate but I need to renew it – if required. There is a lot to consider (H&S/Food Hygiene, itemising list of ingredients, re-heating instructions/labelling etc etc) and I am most grateful for your initial help in assessing if there is a demand for this service. If you have any questions, please ask me.
