At the May meeting the newly elected members were welcomed on to the Parish Council and it was agreed unanimously to send a letter to Mr Graham Jelley, Chairman for the past 4 years, who lost his seat as a result of a ballot conducted by the Returning Officer after an equality of votes, expressing our appreciation of the considerable amount of work undertaken by him while in office.

Members of the public may attend parish council meetings; although they have no right to speak, the Chairman will usually afford them the opportunity on matters raised by or affecting them.

The gift to George Fendley from the Parish Council and villagers in appreciation of his work in the village consists of an electric kettle, an electric razor and a year's subscription to the INDEPENDENT.

The Council has accepted the kind offer of Mr & Mrs Gordon Wootton to replace the oak tree originally planted on the village green to commemorate the Queen's Jubilee.
