NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Nottingham Knockers. There are doorstep callers who target areas offering small household products for sale. Sometimes called 'Nottingham Knockers' these callers may claim to be ex-convicts attempting to mend their ways, however Nottingham Knockers are not part of any recognised rehabilitation scheme. Please be warned not to open the door to strangers or buy or sell on the doorstep. Some doorstep callers may offer poor quality goods at inflated prices and if a caller is not genuine, they may be gathering information for future crime. Please keep in mind that if cold callers don't get any sales in your area, they are less likely to return.

An incident recently occurred where an elderly lady was targeted by a rogue trader in Welford Road, Creaton. At approximately 11.30 two males offered to do some work at the lady's house, fixing a few roofing slates, it is understood they may also have offered to clean the guttering out.

They took £20 off the lady and left saying that they had to get something. Upon returning they told her the cost of the work was £120 but an astute neighbour told them to pack up their tools and leave, no other information is available other than two men were last seen driving towards Spratton in a Yellow Transit Van and wearing tops saying "MF Roofing."

Should you have heard of any other similar incident in, please let the police know and be warned not to do business with traders who cold call.

The Parish Council met on Wednesday 20th January. Among the issues discussed was the forthcoming elections to the Parish Council; further information on what is involved and election procedure is contained elsewhere in this newsletter.

Council passed the proposed budget for 2016/17. Although we have maintained the budget at last year's figure, due to a change in the council tax base rate that is used to calculate the charge to the individual householder, there will be a 1% increase in the parish council element of your council tax charge.

It was brought to the Council's notice that due to a recent accident on Old Road, the road surface near the bend on the hill close to the T junction is particularly vulnerable to freezing up. We ask parishioners to take extra care on that bend.

Once again the issue of dogs barking, particularly during the night, has been raised. May we ask dog owners to continue helping us in dealing with this issue?

If any villagers have concerns over the behaviour of particular dogs then please remember that DCC employs a Dog Warden. Phone -01327 871100

The Parish Council Broadband Working Party along with other members of the council, met with a representative from Gigaclear on the 25th November and discussed the placing of their cabinet as well as any potential issues involved in the laying of their cables. Would you like to stand for election to the Parish Council?

- *If you are eighteen or older, you can stand for election.*
- *If you are a British, Commonwealth or EU citizen and have lived or worked in the parish for a year or already have your name on the electoral roll, you are eligible.*
- *Meetings are rarely more frequent than one evening a month, and missing the occasional one is acceptable. Most meetings only take a couple of hours.*
- *Putting in for planning permission has got nothing to do with sitting on the council.*
- *There is help, advice and training available for new councillors and the clerk, who is the officer of the council, will explain the rules.*
- *The code of conduct councillors have to sign is there to protect councillors. The declaration of interest forms completed at the outset only asks you to list business interests within the parish area and is there to guard against bias when parish issues are debated.*
