### CALA UPDATE

#### 7.5T Zonal Weight Restrictions

On the 21<sup>st</sup> June, CALA made a presentation to the Daventry District Area Committee, for inclusion in the Sustainable Minor Works Programme.

The 16 villages of CALA are frequently plagued by large HGV earth aggregate vehicles, "rat -running" through our villages and lanes, using roads totally unsuitable for this type of traffic.

The zonal area covers the 16 villages bounded by the A14;A43;A508 & A5076 and has been named as the "Black Triangle"

The campaign has had cross-party support and endorsement from Phil Sawford MP; County and District Councillors; the CPRE and NCC's Highways and Route Management departments.

CALA is pleased to announce that our application was successful and secured a unanimous vote by the Committee and is thus included in the 2004/5 Programme.

The aim is to bring back some tranquillity and safety to all the villages and we look forward to the commencement of the scheme.
