## Scaldwell History.

### More news one the Peckett 0-6-OST "SCALDWELL"



The narrow gauge train was used to carry ironstone from the quarry in Scaldwell to sidings near Hanging Houghton for onward transport. It is a very rare genuine Bristol-built three-foot-gauge locomotive which worked in the essential ironstone industry during the First World War and after.

"Scaldwell" had been part of the Amberley Museum for many years, but no longer fitted into their collection as their onsite railway is two-foot-gauge. In July 2017 the train was moved from the Amberley Museum to the Southwold Railway Trust. It was transported by low-loader and by mid-afternoon it was in its new building. It had been in the open for some years and had superficial rust and damage but the basics were good. Peckett had a reputation for over-engineering their products and "Scaldwell" was remarkably complete, with almost all its fittings intact and even came with a spare set of unused wheels and axles.

After a certain amount of persuasion, the wheels turned. The first stage after transport was to remove all the valuable and irreplaceable fittings which was done immediately. Then the loco was cleaned up, with a great deal of scale removed: removal of the steam dome cover (which is being polished) and the safety valves and top piece, revealed that inside, the condition of the fittings were very good indeed.

The loco is due to be dismantled, with cab, bunker and saddle tank removed allowing the boiler/firebox/smokebox assembly, once all the pipework is removed, to be raised so that testing and examination can be done

According to the internet you can see the loco (but not climb onto it) on Saturdays and Sunday (and most Wednesdays) in August at Blythe Road, Southwold, between 10 and 4. Park by the water tower (its free) and walk north over the common until you reach the SR trackbed. The site is north of that, a few hundred yards from the station site.
