The Parish Council are currently undertaking a survey of the trees on the Village Greens and those which we have a responsibility to maintain. We are very grateful to our Tree Warden, Dylan Lewis, who has arranged for students from Moulton College to carry out the survey. Many thanks also to Martin Howard who has very kindly offered the use of his cherry picker for the aerial inspections.

The Parish Council are looking into the possibility of producing a Neighbourhood Plan – the latest requirement by the Planning Authorities regarding future development within Parishes. There is increasing pressure from central government to build more homes in our area and all villages may be required to provide possible building sites if there is a proven requirement for more housing. Although our Village Design Statement is still used as supplementary guidance for planners, if we wish to have any say over the possible siting of future development we would require a Neighbourhood Plan. We shall be consulting all Parishioners as this would require a team of volunteers and many hours of hard work! We shall report back once we have more information.

Our AGM of the Parish Council will be held at 7pm on May 21st in the Village Hall, followed by the Annual Parish Meeting at 8pm. We invite all Parishioners to attend the Meetings, and would like to point out that the Parish Meeting is for the benefit of the Parish. We will outline our activities over the past year and receive reports from all the organisations within the village. This is also the opportunity for all electors to raise concerns, ask questions or discuss any matters with the Parish Council. This is the only meeting at which all electors are entitled to vote, as opposed to Parish Council Meetings where only the Councillors have a vote. Please do come along – it is most informative and if you are new to the village it's an excellent way of hearing about the activities within the village.

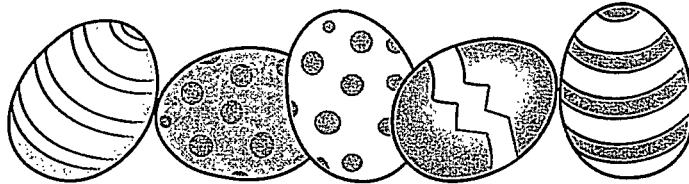
We have our Mexican Evening on 29th March.

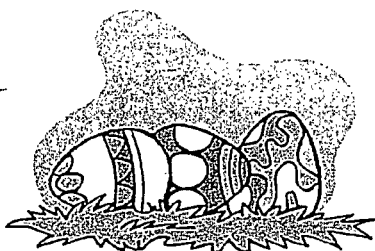

DID YOU KNOW THAT SCALDWELL HAD A STEAM ENGINE???



The legend that was Scaldwell. From Amberly Museum and Heritage Centre:

"Built by Pecket of Bristol, "Scaldwell" was supplied as on 0-6-0ST version of a standard Pecket class M3 locomotive (an 0-4-0St standard gauge design) to the Scaldwell Ironstone Quarries in Northamptonshire. Working on their system with another Pecket named "Lamport" they were employed hauling wooden wagons from the quarry to the transhipment siding where the loads of ironstone were tipped into standard gauge wagons.

The system closed in 1963 but "Scaldwell" was saved by the Brockham Museum in 1962 and was even steamed, once in order, to get her into a new shed.

"Scaldwell" was taken to Amberly in 1981.

You will probably have spotted the deliberate mistake in the last Newsletter. I put in last year's winners!!
