Items of interest raised at the annual parish meeting attended by our two D.D.C. councillors Mrs Iris Bates & Mr Peter Fletcher.

COMMUNITY HELP SCHEME Based at Brixworth will be a team who will provide FREE labour for work, such as gardening, painting & decorating to any pensioner & people receiving supplementary benefit. Application forms are available at The Post Office & Home Farmhouse.

BUS SHELTER Appeals were made to parents & Youth Club members to put an end to the filthy state of the bus shelter following misuse by children who ought to know better. The local policeman is supporting the parish council in this campaign. Any further misuse will result in drastic action being taken. There are many people in the village who use it for its intended purpose.
