We have recently been involved in the
review of Planning for the Region over
the next 20 years, and believe it would be

features and character of the Village,

News From SAS

Community Speedwatch Schemes

The insert in the Newsletter indicates the growth in these schemes throughout the country, some 43 areas now taking part.

It particularly focuses on the Northampton area and you will be aware that Scaldwell was at the forefront of the CSW in 2004.

For 2005, the responsibility and co-ordination for the scheme is with our Parish Council, 4 members of whom are

prepared to join the other 12 residents, who have volunteered to participate.

In order to reduce village speeds, potentially saving lives, it is hoped that our Parish Council will take advantage of the opportunity made available to it for this year.

Following the note above, as at today, 21st July, I have learnt that Scaldwell Parish Council is unable to run the Community Speedwatch Scheme in 2005 unlike the majority of other Parish Councils nationwide.

When details of the Scheme were handed over to Scaldwell PC on 4th July there was sufficient time to take over and administer the Scheme given a modicum of effort. All information was supplied to them and enough volunteers had already been trained by the Police to enable the scheme to run successfully.

Having pressed hard from Scaldwell PC, I have now been informed that they are looking for a replacement Co-ordinator but have declined to administer the Scheme themselves. We appreciate that PC members have a number of duties, including planning applications to administer. However, most applications affect a small proportion of the village at any one time, whereas the CSW scheme could help to enhance safety for all village residents.

I find it disturbing that not one member out of seven of the Parish Councillors could be deputed as Scheme Co-ordinator in view of the benefits that would accrue to all. Equally disturbing is the fact that refusal to run the Scheme this year puts Scaldwell at risk as other Parish Councils in surrounding villages have their own commuter rat-running problems and are pressing hard for inclusion in the Community Speedwatch Scheme.

In my opinion, Scaldwell PC has given 'lip service' in support of this scheme but their unwillingness to participate demonstrates a considerable lack of care and vision. It is Scaldwell residents who will lose the opportunity to experience a safe environment in 2005
