FAMILY WELFARE ASSOCIATION

I have been asked to include the following details in this edition of our village newsletter.

"The Northampton branch of the Family Welfare Association (FWA) is currently developing a service providing leisure and recreation opportunities for those children/young people (3-19 years) living in rural Northamptonshire, who are disabled or handicapped.

The Association is seeking to build up a pool of volunteers who would be willing to engage in one-to-one support for such youngsters e.g. accompanying them on day trips, or organising small groups within their local communities.

Referrals to the service will be via the local Social Services Department/ Health Authorities etc. Every effort will be made to ensure that volunteers and young people referred are well suited.

All volunteers need references and would have to undergo police checks - routine when working with young children. Experience of working with the young and disabled would be helpful. Volunteer expenses will be reimbursed and ongoing support provided.
