PARISH COUNCIL

Heavy Lorries The Deputy County Surveyor, Mr. M. Sharpe, attended our December meeting and outlined a plan to reduce substantially the flow of heavy traffic through our village. He was warmly thanked by villagers who were present in large numbers, and by the Parish Council. Now we are keeping our fingers crossed for positive results.

Planning There has been a spate of planning applications recently. So far we have heard that outline approval has been given for the conversion of a barn into a single dwelling house at Oak Farm, School Lane; and full approval has been given for the extension of the Village Hall, which will enable work to be started in March to qualify for the grant already approved local authorities.

Brixworth By-Pass An exhibition was held in Brixworth to show the proposed new by-pass 2.1 miles long using land to the east of Brixworth. The A508 will leave the existing main road at a roundabout by the Sailing Club, passing under Holcot Road, crossing Scaldwell Road by way of a roundabout, past the amenity tip and rejoining the present road about $\frac{3}{4}$ mile north at which point the old road will be blocked off.

PARISH COUNCIL (Cont'd.)

Finance We have asked for a parish precept of £1350 for 1987/88 (£1200 last year) in the hope that we can increase our end-of-year balance as required by the District Auditor. It is estimated that our parish rate will not exceed 4.8p in the £ (currently 4.2p).

CHARITIES

The Trustees of Scaldwell Parish Trust have agreed to pay for churchyard mowing again this year. They have also agreed to make a grant of £100 to the Youth Club; this will enable the club to keep attendance fees down to 20p per head throughout 1987.

The Trustees are willing to sponsor another day trip during the summer holidays - any suggestions will be welcomed. They are also prepared to pay £100 towards materials required for the forthcoming M.S.C. Community Project in carrying out improvements to the Village Green and the Village Pump.

BLUE PETER APPEAL Jonathon and Adam Partridge, Catherine, Mark and Simon Vinton would like to thank all who supported the Blue Peter Bring and Buy Sale held in the Village Hall on December 3rd. The £168.70 raised included proceeds from a raffle and a single donation of £55. The cash will go to the Sight for Africa Appeal, to send medical equipment to Malawi to help people with eye problems.
