Matters dealt with at the September meeting included:-

Crime Prevention - On the 4th October (Tuesday) at 7.30 p.m. for about an hour the Police are giving a presentation in the Village Hall on this very important subject. All are welcome, but don't forget to lock up before attending!

Stubble Burning - In view of the considerable pollution and nuisance experienced in the village and elsewhere this year, we have sent a resolution to Daventry pressing them to get the County Council to pass a bye-law banning this obnoxious and harmful practice in the County.

Dogs - We wish to draw the attention of all dog owners to the bye-law in respect of dogs fouling footpaths and verges carrying a £50 penalty. For obvious reasons villagers are asked not to exercise their dogs on the playing field.

Parish Clerk - We heard with regret that Mike Hall will be leaving the village soon, but will continue in office until the end of December to help a new Clerk take over. We have been fortunate in Scaldwell in having efficient and conscientious Clerks recently in Mike and his predecessor, Ron Bottomley - a big thank you to them both.
