Our Annual Report was presented at the Annual Parish Meeting and it is enclosed with this Newsletter.

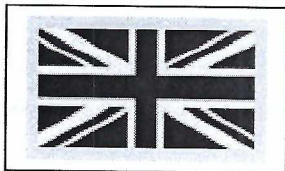

Chairman's Report

The Parish Council elections will have taken place by the time this report is published. Once again we are delighted with the amount of interest from so many villagers about becoming a Councillor. This is uncommon in many villages and this May, Scaldwell is the only Parish in the Daventry District to have a contested election. The above list of councillors will therefore have changed since the election, but thank you to all the villagers who have shown an interest in the work of the Parish Council and to the many villagers who have worked for the benefit of the village in so many ways in the past year.

The following list briefly outlines the activities of the Parish Council; further information is available on our website, or from any of the Councillors:-

Parish Council activities during the year to 31 March 2012

Meetings

Seven Council meetings were held during the year. All meetings are open to the public. Notice of meetings and the agenda are displayed on the bus shelter notice board and Parish Council website approximately one week prior to the meeting.

The Parish Council has continued to receive support by District Councillor Liz Wiig and County Councillor Chris Millar. Often their support and advice goes unnoticed but the councillors are aware of how much they do in the background, in support of our village.

At the time of writing we do not know the outcome of the Parish Council election, but I

would like to thank Alisdair Tait for his work as councillor over the past four years and particularly Frank Wiig, who, as both Parish and District Councillor has provided invaluable assistance to the village and Parish Council. As Alisdair has moved out of the village he has decided not to continue as councillor; unfortunately Frank's poor health has prevented him from continuing and we all wish him well.

The new list of councillors will be included in the next village newsletter.

The Council has continued to respond to concerns raised by villagers on a variety of matters such as those concerning planning, Rights of Way and dog fouling. The Council communicates regularly with the District and County Councils and their representative councillors, with MGWSP on Highways and Rights of Way issues and with neighbouring parish councils. In addition the Council has continued to oversee street lighting in the village and maintenance of the village greens. Councillors and the Clerk have represented the council at various meetings such as the local police Community Panel Meetings, local charities and village organisations.

Highways

The Parish Council has been in regular contact with MGWSP and Northamptonshire County Council to ensure the roads and signage are maintained to a good standard and to press for quick repairs to potholes, damaged signs and replacement of salt in the salt bins. Some of the village street signs were repainted during the year.

Playing field

Great credit goes to the work of the Scaldwell Playing Field Community Group for all their efforts and success in improving the playing field and fundraising for new equipment. Congratulations to all who have been involved with this project.

The transformation of the field is tremendous and we are delighted that plans are in place to ensure the sustainability of the field and its equipment.

We are in the process of having the playing field designated a Queen Elizabeth II Playing Field as part of the Diamond Jubilee celebrations.

Parish Council Website

The website has continued to be a very useful method of keeping villagers informed of Council activities and village matters. Copies of the agendas and minutes of Council meetings are available to download from the site which is regularly updated with council news including details of recent planning applications. Over the past year the website received an average of 160 visits per month.

Finance

The Council has made efforts to ensure it is getting best value for money. A copy of the Annual Accounts is included in this report. As the Parish Council has been dealing with the finances for the playing field, the income and expenditure looks considerably higher than usual.

Quality Status
