There is some evidence that speeds are ^{once} ~~one~~ again increasing through our village, principally during 'commuter' times.

We understand ^{that} ~~the~~ the Community Speed Watch scheme does not find favour with everyone but, given the reality, is the alternative to do nothing and let our village become a racetrack? With the limited resources available to the Police, as in common with many villages up and down the country, we feel some steps should be taken to protect not only our environment but the safety of Scaldwell residents.

Last year, after considerable effort, we were able to participate in the Community Speed Watch programme, organised by Northamptonshire ACRE and the Police Safety Camera Team. Because we administered the scheme responsibly, we have been invited to participate again in 2005 and, hopefully, heighten awareness of speeding through our village and to remind the errant motorist of the posted limits.

This can only happen if you, the residents, give additional support to the small dedicated nucleus of observers who worked so hard last year for the benefit of the whole community.

Additional volunteers are needed for the 1 hour sessions - if you are prepared to assist, please call on 881876, so that the rotas can be compiled to suit your individual availabilities.

If we do not get enough additional support, then regretfully, we will have to decline to participate, on behalf of the village.
