Following the discussion at the Annual Parish Meeting a meeting has been held with representatives of the County Council to discuss means of reducing the speed of traffic through the village. As a result of this some alterations will be made to the road signs for the bends at each end of the village.

They expressed doubts as to whether traffic calming measures would be desirable in the centre of the village since many of them would lead to a significant increase in noise. The village has been put on the list for consideration for traffic calming but at present there is no budget for any further steps to be taken so progress is unlikely to be swift.

There will be a Parish Council meeting in September at which the councillors will be discussing the recommendations of the Local Government Commissioners for the reorganisation of local government in Northamptonshire. If you have any views on this matter please talk to any member of the Council or else attend the meeting where an opportunity will be given to members of the public to speak on the issue.
