Since the last newsletter the new Parish Council has taken office following the elections held on 7th May. who have taken their place. The full list of Council members is on the noticeboard.

The Annual Parish Meeting was held on 19th May. This is the meeting where all village societies and charities are asked to give a short account of their year and where all villagers are free to bring up and discuss any matter of general concern to the village.

It was clear from the meeting that many residents have become very concerned about the young people who have been congregating around the bus shelter on the village green. There has been a significant nuisance caused to people living around the Green in terms of noise particularly from car radios. Many others in the village have complained about examples of dangerous driving particularly the use of high speeds on the minor roads in the village where children are often unwary. There is also a lot of unsightly litter and some damage to the bus shelter itself.

Although it is appreciated that many of the young people concerned do not come from the village please will all residents behave with consideration for others and try to ensure that their friends and children do the same.

The meeting hoped that the recent intervention of the police coupled with this reminder would help to improve matters.

On a different matter, recent Government guidelines have stated that dogs should be banned from children's playgrounds and this reinforces the Parish Council's difficult decision last year to ban dogs from the recreation ground. I am pleased to say that there has been a big improvement on the state of the ground since the ban has taken effect.

The Parish Council has decided to oppose the County Council's application to extend the life of Brixworth Tip to 1997.
