### PARISH COUNCIL

#### KATH FRANKLAND

#### Ward Action Service Plan (WASP)

It was agreed at the recent meeting of the Parish Council to apply for a grant to complete the alterations and repairs to the Village Hall. A number of villagers also backed this application to Daventry District Council. If the application is successful, repair work can be done to on the windows and the roof.

#### Traffic Count

The final analysis of the count for all the villages is not yet completed but Scaldwell villagers, particularly those who kindly volunteered to do the count, might be interested in our own count which took place on 25<sup>th</sup> May, 2000. As might be expected, the busiest times were approximately 7.30am – 9.0am and 4.30pm – 6.30pm. At these times (taken together) 383 vehicles (excluding HGV's) went through Scaldwell from the Old direction and 454 went through from beyond Scaldwell towards the old direction. Few HGV's were counted.

#### Buses

The new bus Time-table has now been published. There are now two buses from Scaldwell Monday to Friday at 9.10am and 12.20pm returning at 11.40am and 2.30pm from Northampton. There is also a bus on Saturday morning, leaving Scaldwell at 8.45am and returning from Northampton at 11.30am. I will put a copy of the new Time-table on the notice board. Please use them if possible, otherwise we might lose them again.

#### Daventry District Council Information Service

By now, I am sure everybody has had information about this service. If not, I have posted one on the notice board. They hope to expand the number of services available in the next few months.

### **Footpaths**

Some villagers have expressed an interest in creating some kind of footpath on the grass verge linking the end of the pavement (roughly at Peters End) and Mill Lane.
