Court Booking - Major problems have arisen this summer, due to some children double and block booking the court. The rules for booking state that only one game can be booked at a time - i.e. book your game, play it and then book the next one. Also children are booking in more than one game i.e. 6 p.m. Jane Brown and Fred Bloggs, 7 p.m. Fred Bloggs and Jane Brown. This is obviously not fair as others wanting to use the court and totally unacceptable. If the court is not in use, members may play without prior booking. Please also look carefully at times already booked, as double booking is occurring. A court session is of one hour's duration and must be vacated promptly if others are waiting. Times run on the hour i.e. 6pm - 7pm not 6.30pm to 7.15pm. If you start playing late at 7.15pm you must still end at 8pm if the court is booked then. (The exception to the rule is League matches which must be given priority and may last longer than one hour). From now until September the court is for adult use only from 5 pm every weekday - children may only play if no adult has prior booking.

May I remind all members to leave no litter on court, not to smoke on court and not to bring unleashed dogs on to the field and not to take dogs on the court. The shed has been broken into and there is evidence of smoking having taken place in it - if you know the culprits, please tell them to keep out as we do not want the shed to burn down! Please will parents make sure their children are aware of the above points.
