Finally, I am receiving many complaints about the trading and storage of vehicles at Mill Lane Barns, despite DDC refusing the planning application for this activity. An enforcement notice was issued, although it continues to be ignored. We are keeping Daventry aware of the situation, but need to be advised of any further activity, so if you have any evidence relating to this, please inform the Parish Council.
