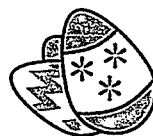

The Parish Council met on Wednesday March 15th. Following the decision at January's, meeting, Council asked BT if we could adopt the Phone Box. BT has agreed to our request and there now follows a 90-day consultation period. Council has also approached Daventry regarding the Grade Listed status of the phone box. Once all has been agreed, the telephone service will be discontinued and we will then install the defibrillator and arrange for training.

As you may recall, Council undertook a survey of the trees on The Green. Following up on recommendations made in the final report to Council, it has been agreed that work on the trees will start shortly. Quotes were received, and the council has decided to appoint 'Independent Tree & Fencing' to undertake the work. Sadly, one of the recommendations was to fell one of the Beech trees, which we have agreed to. It is anticipated that something will be planted in its place in due course. May we ask, therefore, that people do not park their cars on The Green opposite the bus shelter, please, and to be considerate when parking round The Green?

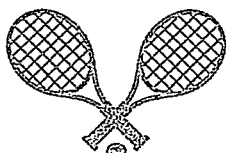
Following a meeting with Highways, new road signs have been painted onto Scaldwell Road before the bend. We hope this will help to slow drivers down before taking the sharp bend.

You will have noticed that much of the Ivy covering the pump and wall on The Green has been removed. As a result, it was discovered that the wooden box covering the old pump is in a bad state of repair. However, rather than just repairing it, Council would like to know if any of our fellow villagers would like to undertake a community project to repair/replace the existing wall, expose and repair the original pump and make the whole area a feature of the village. Council would of course be able to offer some assistance and guidance, but we believe it should be a village community-led project rather than a council initiative. Please contact any of the councillors or the clerk to express an interest.

A breakthrough service called BT Call Protect is available to BT customers which will identify nuisance calls on the BT blacklist and automatically send them to your junk voicemail. You are able to also add other calls to your blacklist so that they are diverted also.

You can instigate the system and manage your settings and personal blacklist at bt.com/btcallprotect where you log in using your BT ID, or dial 1572 from your home phone.

BT Call Protect is a free service and subscribers to BT1571 and Call Minder will automatically be provided with the service by 31st March 2017 in any event.
