We are delighted to report that we have now been awarded 'Quality Council' status, and would like to express our gratitude to our Clerk for undertaking the rigorous training programme, as well as ensuring that we met all the criteria required to qualify. We are the first parish council in the Daventry district to have achieved this status. Well done Jonathan.

At our recent meeting, we were very pleased to welcome Sergeant Mike Grady who is our local Police Officer and has a small team based in Brixworth. He reported on the crime in the area, and although we have had very few crimes committed in Scaldwell in the past, he did stress the need for us all to be more security conscious, and is providing us with leaflets which contain some useful information on the subject. It has also been brought to our attention that there have been several traders cold calling in our village recently, and we have stickers which can be displayed at your front door to discourage unwanted callers. The stickers and leaflets can be obtained from the Clerk or from Michael Alcock, our Neighbourhood Watch co-ordinator (881948)

We would still be very interested to hear from anyone who has a suggestion about which play or sports equipment would be best for the playing field. We are hoping to make an

application for funding, but need to know what is required.

The recent Planning Application for the conversion of the barn off of Holcot Lane has been dismissed at Appeal – I am sure that many villagers who felt so strongly about this application will be very relieved.

The fingerposts on the village green have now been replaced and look very smart indeed, many thanks to Eddie Cockram for taking on the project and making such a great job of it!

The County Council have suggested that all villages should consider devising an 'Emergency Planning Pack/ Community self-help plan' in the event of a disaster or crisis occurring which could result in the village being cut off for a period of time. We will be discussing this at our next statutory meeting, but think it would be a good idea to form a small group who would be prepared to work together on this project. If you could spare some time and would like to be involved please attend the meeting or contact me to discuss it.
