Street Lighting - At last the new street light programme is complete. They are operated by photo-electric cells set to give all night lighting. We have been advised that this system is more cost-effective, both to operate and maintain, and will give the village some measure of extra security during the hours of darkness. Would villagers please notify the Parish Clerk of any lights not working.

Planning - Plans have been received for an extension to Crawshaw Robbins' yard and for 4 houses at Poplars Farm. Comments from adjacent residents have been noted and Daventry District Council informed.
