SCALDWELL PARISH COUNCIL - Alison Goodenough

As was reported at the Parish Meeting in May, the Parish Council has approached Daventry District Council with a view to buying the recreation ground from them. This request is still under consideration at Daventry but the Parish Council is trying to get a firm answer as soon as possible.

The problem of dogs fouling the recreation ground has continued despite requests in the newsletter. Therefore, the Parish Council has decided to ban dogs from the recreation ground completely and a Notice to this effect will be put up. We shall be grateful if all dog owners in the Village will observe this ban.

The County Council has notified the Parish Council that it is proposing to extend the Brixworth Tip over a further ten acres of land towards Mill Lane thus extending the life of the tip by some 18 months. The Parish Council has opposed this proposal.

On other Planning matters, an Appeal has been made against the Refusal of Outline Planning Permission for a proposed scheme of development of the site adjoining 1 Old Road. This has been opposed by the Parish Council.

Knights of Old have applied for Permission to move their Cherry Hill Depot to a site on the A43 at Moulton. The Parish Council has written to the District Council to point out the benefits of this scheme for Villages such as Scaldwell which currently suffer such a great amount of heavy traffic.
