### Update on the vacancy:

The position for the new priest-in-charge in the Walgrave benefice is currently being re-advertised in the Church Times and on the Peterborough Diocesan website with a longer time for applicants to apply than the previous occasion in July. We have scheduled an interview date for candidates for 2nd November. This means that it is highly unlikely that a new incumbent will be installed before Christmas and as a result the Lay Ministry team have met and agreed how all the normal benefice services for Christmas will be covered. As usual there will be a Christmas Eve Carol Service in Scaldwell at 4.00pm, a midnight Communion Service at Hannington and a 10.00am Family Communion at Walgrave on Christmas Day. If we have a successful candidate at the interview in November then I would anticipate that installation would happen in January or February next year.

Since the previous newsletter, the Parish Council has met on three occasions.

On the 1<sup>st</sup> August. Business included an update from Councillor Purcell on Street Lighting; he is still awaiting further information regarding the street lighting options within the village and hopes to make a presentation at the next council meeting. In September's meeting, council agreed to update the street lighting. We will keep villagers informed of our developments.

Councillor Purcell also reported that in the latest Speedwatch, 134 vehicles were caught speeding with 54 mph being the fastest speed recorded.

It was also agreed that Wicksteed would carry out our annual inspection of the Playing field.

A retrospective planning application from The Grange was discussed with council recommending refusal of the application

Council met again on the 8<sup>th</sup> August where it was agreed to transfer ownership of the Church clock to the PCC who will be responsible for the preservation of the clock. The meeting also agreed the necessary repair work to the Fort in the Playing Field.

Council met on 26<sup>th</sup> September where the issue of a bus service was discussed. As you know, the local bus service ceased to operate from 22<sup>nd</sup> July. However, Walgrave Wellbeing Centre is offering Scaldwell Parish Council the opportunity to make use of their 15-seater minibus. This would allow us to offer a limited local bus service to villagers who wish to travel to, for example Brixworth/Kettering /Market Harborough, etc. There would be a cost and volunteer commitment upon the Council, so we need to know if there is a demand in the village for such a service before we proceed any further. If you think you would be interested in making use of such a service, please inform one of the parish councillors.

It has been drawn to Council's attention that there is, at times, a lot of noise in the village from dogs barking. We appreciate this is very difficult to control but may we ask dog owners to continue to assist us in this matter.

The next Parish Council meeting will be held at 7.30pm in the Village Hall on Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> November 2018. All parishioners are most welcome to attend.
