All members of the Council were greatly saddened by the sudden and untimely death of Mr. Graham Jelley. He was a member of the Council himself for many years and a conscientious and hardworking chairman for four years. His contribution to the village will be greatly missed.

As you will all know Graham had kindly agreed to act as the co-ordinator for the village Neighbourhood Watch Scheme shortly before his death. Now we need another public spirited individual to take on this role. If you are willing

Now to happier matters, the Parish Council considered its finances at its December meeting and decided to hold its precept to the District Council steady for the forthcoming year. Any increase in the Community Charge next year will not be our fault!

There has been a significant increase over the last few months in the amount of litter left in and around the bus shelter. The shelter is already suffering from minor vandalism and graffiti and this is making the Green very unsightly. Please could all villagers and more particularly the teenagers be especially careful in using the litter bin and taking care of the shelter.

A new tree has been planted on the Green in place of the dead cherry. The money for this was provided by the workers of the Lamport Hall Trust who donated it in memory of Frank Moore. Frank cared for the Green for many years and we hope that the sight of the new whitebeam will serve to remind all of us of his contribution to the village.

The Parish Council has been in correspondence with the County Council over the repair of the steps in the High Street. After a meeting on site it has been decided that the steps will be sandblasted to clear away accumulated debris. The top pavement surface will be repaired with tarmac and the lower kerb will be repaired with an epoxy mortar which should last longer than previous repairs. The intervening steps will have most of the gaps filled with a normal mortar leaving a few spaces where small wild flowers may be encouraged to grow (at the special plea of the conservationists amongst us!)

A final plea to residents. Please try not to park on the pavements, especially when this blocks them for pedestrians. If people with pushchairs have to wheel their child out in the road in order to get past a parked vehicle obstructing the pavement then clearly there is a potential danger which should not occur. Parking on pavements is illegal in any event, so please make sure you and your visitors leave enough space for pedestrians to pass freely.
