The Parish Council met on Wednesday January 18<sup>th</sup>. Council agreed to approach BT to begin the process of adopting the Phone box, in order to install a defibrillator. Once that is done, we will then have to approach DCC, as the phone box is Grade listed. Council has already received a grant of £400 through our local DCC Councillor and we have made an application to Scaldwell Parish Trust for further funding. Any short fall will be met from the council's reserves.

Council agreed the budget for 2016/17, which will see a very small increase in the precept.

As reported in the last newsletter, council has been in contact with Gigaclear, and their subcontractors, and some remedial work has been carried out. However, we are continuing to ensure that all the issues raised are resolved as soon as possible.

There has been an increase in opportunistic vehicle crime in some of the local villages so we ask that villagers are extra careful about keeping cars locked and valuables out of sight.

## NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Action Fraud has received several reports from victims who have been sent convincing looking emails claiming to be from Amazon. The spoofed emails from "[service@amazon.co.uk](mailto:service@amazon.co.uk)" claim recipients have made an order online and mimic an automatic customer email notification.

The scam email claims recipients have ordered an expensive vintage chandelier. Other reported examples include: Bose stereos, iPhone's and luxury watches.

The emails cleverly state that if recipients haven't authorised the transaction they can click on the help centre link to receive a full refund. The link leads to an authentic-looking website, which asks victims to confirm their name, address, and bankcard information.

Amazon says that suspicious e-mails will often contain:

- Links to websites that look like [Amazon.co.uk](http://Amazon.co.uk) but aren't [Amazon.co.uk](http://Amazon.co.uk).
- Attachments or prompts to install software on your computer.
- Typos or grammatical errors.
- Forged (or spoofed) e-mail addresses to make it look like the e-mail is coming from [Amazon.co.uk](http://Amazon.co.uk).

Amazon will never ask for personal information to be supplied by e-mail.
