**2010 COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH SCHEME**

It has been recognised by the Police that the number one policing priority for ours and surrounding villagers is tackling local speeding traffic. If, like me, you are concerned about speeding traffic through our village and surrounding roads and can spare 1-2 hours of your time – then you can help make a difference.

The Community Speedwatch scheme aims to provide local people with both the tools and support to initiate monitoring of speeding traffic through their environments. The scheme is run by the Local Police Authority and supported by ACRE (Action with Communities in Rural England) enabling villages such as ours to monitor and report offenders to the Police who can then initiate appropriate action.

Scaldwell is one of a growing number of villages that are fortunate enough to have sought and received support from the Police in this respect – but does require community support to make the scheme a success. The Scaldwell Scheme **urgently requires new volunteers** – who will receive expert tuition and training from the Police on the use of equipment and other related topics.

The village has been offered use of the Speedwatch equipment for the period from June 27th through to August 8th. Training is to be provided on June 19th. If you would like to support me in this exercise, or would just like to know more about the scheme activity itself then I would love to hear from you.

In the meantime some useful stats about Scaldwell received from the Police Traffic surveys.

**46% of traffic found so speed through the village above 30mph**

**19% of traffic found to speed through the village above 35mph**

Highest speeds recorded – Bike at 54mph  
Car – 52mph  
Van – 42 mph  
HGV – 37mph

The above information is based on two surveys covering two separate weeks and totalled over 18,000 vehicles!! (Yes there is that much traffic coming through this community). You can do the maths – but this shows a huge number of vehicles speeding through the village – and one that will

continue to cause accidents/injuries on our highway.
