## PARISH COUNCIL

ALISON GOODENOUGH

THE ANNUAL PARISH MEETING and the annual meeting of the Parish Council were held on Wed 24 May. Nick Patchesa resigned as Chairman of the PC, although he will remain on the Council. He has been Chairman for some eight years and a hearty vote of thanks was given to him for all his hard work for the village during that period. Jack Dodds-Smith agreed to become Chairman in his place, but only until next May when elections take place; he will not be standing.

The PC decided to defer the appointment of Vice-Chairman until the next meeting since it was felt this would give more time to discuss the matter.

The PC has been making further enquiries about trying to obtain more bus services for the village and it is hoped that some progress can soon be made. The County Council has already agreed in principle to the primary school bus to Brixworth being opened to fare-paying passengers. We hope this service, which will operate during school terms only, will begin in September.

Planning consent has been given for the installation at the Brixworth landfill site of equipment for the generation of electricity from methane. After a site meeting to discuss the proposals it was felt that the environmental impact of the plant and flare had been minimised as far as possible.

At the Annual Parish Meeting the accounts of the village charities were presented and approved. There is currently under discussion a scheme by the Charity Commissioners to modernise the running of the Thomas Roe Charity, and widen its educational objects. For further details please see the notice board or talk to me.

As last Chairman of the Scaldwell Society, Wally Forsyth presented a report to the meeting. The only function still being carried on by the society is the Pensioners' Christmas Dinner, and the remaining funds of the Society have helped bear the costs of this. He hopes to call a meeting of the Society later in the year to put this on a more regular footing.

On planning matters the PC agreed to support the application by the Village Hall Trustees to renew the consent to allow sound amplification equipment to be used in the building. They also agreed to support the application for the renewal of consent for the activities of Counterpoint in the Barn at The Old House. This latter was, however, recommended for a limited term only, to see if concerns about parking can be met.

Finally, I have told the PC that I am resigning as Clerk after serving for over 6 years. I feel a new Clerk should be appointed by the end of the year so that he or she may get used to the job before the local elections in May 1996. If anyone is interested in becoming Clerk, please speak to any member of the PC or to me, to discuss what it entails. The post carries a small salary, currently some £350 per year, and is an extremely good way to get to know the village and play a significant part in its workings.
