The parish council met on Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> September. Among the issues raised was that of parking, especially in East End and at bends on the High Street. May we repeat that if any vehicle is inconsiderately or dangerously parked that the registration number is taken and passed on to PCSO 7145 **Jo Hillery**, the local Community Police Officer, who will follow it up. Alternatively you could phone the local police non-emergency number 101.

The issue of heavy lorries using East End for access was also raised. After discussions with the recipient of the deliveries these lorries have now been diverted via Holcot Lane.

It would seem that contractor's vans have caused some problems with other vehicles due to them parking close to bends on the High Street. May we therefore ask that if you are anticipating having contractors that you please ask them to park with due attention to the bends on the High Street.

We will be liaising again with Highways to discuss the various traffic problems within the village

We are continuing to look into the maintenance and ease of access of the various footpaths surrounding the village and have been assured that the footpath at the bottom of Holcot Lane will be cleared shortly.

As you will be aware, the two seriously infected lime trees were successfully removed from the green and follow up work will be taking place on the remaining four.

The council also agreed to contact Gigaclear regarding superfast broadband. We will keep villagers informed of any progress.

The next council meeting is scheduled for Wednesday November 19<sup>th</sup> in the village hall. All parishioners are welcome to attend.

The Northamptonshire Police and Crime Commission is currently running a consultation aimed at children and young people across the county, which will help shape a new strategy to tackle online crime.

Social media has become part of our everyday lives but there are risks attached. These range from bullying and harassment through to child sexual exploitation.

We know that online crimes are underreported. This consultation will help the Police and Crime Commission understand the perceived risks and behaviours of young people and their parents so that a programme of education and prevention can be implemented.

Police and Crime Commissioner, Adam Simmonds, said: "Social networking sites feature in virtually every single case our cyber-crime detectives investigate.

"It is vital that we take positive action to tackle online exploitation, and this consultation is a crucial part of that.

Surveys have been devised to capture young peoples' experiences of being online and how they are affected by them, their perceptions of the risks they face and what they would do if they felt something they came across was inappropriate.

Parents and carers are also being asked to complete the survey, to enable the commission to find out how much they understand about the risks children face when they are online.

If this subject is relevant to you, please take a few moments of your time to help us by completing a survey, encouraging children to complete the age appropriate surveys and forwarding this request on to appropriate family and friends.
