PARISH COUNCIL**KATH FRANKLAND**

We held our Parish Council A.G.M. and the Annual Parish Meeting on Tuesday 6th May. As this was the occasion for a report on the year, I thought it might be of interest to include some points in the Newsletter. The meeting itself was well attended to discuss the recent planning application for a Green Waste

Composting Facility at Mill Lane Barns, Scaldwell. This caused great concern to everybody and, by now, I hope all the residents in the village are aware of the application and have written to the County Council to express their views. There was also a presentation given by the Scaldwell against Speeding Group.

Items from the report

We are still anxious to preserve the areas of green which we still have in the village. The Village Green itself is constantly attacked by vehicles, particularly when we have a spell of wet weather. It tends to recover slightly during the summer but, each year, a little more is lost. We hope to find some way of preventing this corrosion without spoiling the look of the green.

Grass - cutting has now commenced for the new year. The areas designated are:- The Green and its verges as far down as the Church, the Playing Field including the swings etc. We will also pay particular attention to the slide mound which was a problem last year because of nettles. Adrian Henson will also trim the boles of the trees which line the Green when necessary. The site beyond the houses on the left hand side of Old Road has also been cleared and the old bin removed.

We have not yet been informed of any road repairs. Please report any bad potholes you may find. We have done some filling of potholes in Holcot Lane which was badly affected by the wet weather before Christmas. Some residents have expressed concern about the speed of certain vehicles through the village. Two surveys have been done, stating that we did not have a serious problem.

The budget remains in a reasonably healthy state. This year will see a small increase in the charge for grass cutting. This is our biggest expense. One of the street lamps had to be repaired as a result of storm damage during the winter. Other expenses are the usual payments for street lighting, maintenance etc. We would like to thank our clerk, Jane, for drawing up our financial report and submitting it to the auditor.

Last summer seemed to be dominated by the problem with a plague of flies which affected some parts of the village more than others. The source of the nuisance was the Landfill site which had received some untreated waste.

The company, SITA, tackled the situation and assured us that it was under control. We should have a meeting with SITA this month when we hope to make sure that there will be no recurrence of the problem.

The annual report from ROSPA on the Playing Field and its equipment proved satisfactory and no repairs were necessary.

In September our clerk, Stan Turner, resigned. He had been clerk since 1996 and we thanked him for his services to the Council. We were very pleased to welcome Jane Jones as his replacement. She has certainly had a baptism of fire since taking on the job, having to grapple with the new audit plus two new initiatives for local councils: The Freedom of Information Act and The Code of Conduct. I would like to take this opportunity to thank her most sincerely for the work she has done.

Finally I would like to thank all the councillors for their help and support during the year. It is much appreciated. Please keep reading the newsletter as it is an excellent way for the Council to inform residents about up to date issues and concerns.

SCALDWELL AGAINST SPEED

Scaldwell has experienced a considerable increase in the volume of traffic in recent years. So on Tuesday May 13th a 12-hour traffic census manned by village volunteers on the Green counted the amount of traffic transiting, visiting or emanating from the village. The figures should make interesting reading to many Scaldwell residents.

In addition to the volume of traffic, it was also noted that whilst many careful motorists keep to the speed limit through the village, there are a number of drivers who need reminding that the maximum permitted speed is **30 m.p.h.** We want to avoid a major accident in Scaldwell that could so easily be caused by a reckless, speeding driver – so **please** remember (and remind others too) to observe the speed limit in the village at all times.

3 years ago the total number of vehicles passing through the village between 7 am and 9 am was 202 and between 4 p.m. and 7p.m. was 324.
