THE SCHOOL Bus SERVICE to BRIXWORTH is now available for use by the public. This service runs on school days only as follows:

The County Council has also arranged the following service for the village instead of the Wednesday Taxi Bus from Monday 25 September.

Mondays to Fridays only

leaving Scaldwell Green at 9.05 am
via Old, Walgrave, Sywell, Moulton, to arrive at Northampton Bus Station at 10.00 am.

SERVICE 62 leaving
Northampton Bus Station at 12.25 pm
via Harborough Road, Boughton, Pilstord, to arrive at Scaldwell Green at 13.10 pm

This new service will remain in place until Easter 1996 when it will be reviewed. It would therefore be helpful if people used the new service as much as possible.

Fares for the new services have still not been notified to the Parish Council, but a notice will be placed on the notice board as soon as we have details.

A bus token scheme is operated by Daventry District Council for pensioners and various categories of disabled people. This enables those qualifying to buy £24 worth of bus tokens per year for £3. If you would like a copy of the details of the scheme please contact me on ☎ 882136.

These services will run in addition to the monthly bus to the Co-op in Kettering and the fortnightly bus to Tesco's at Weston Favell.

There will be a Parish Council Meeting shortly to discuss any matters which have arisen over

the summer. Please keep an eye on the notice board for details.

Finally, I have been asked by those who kindly mow the recreation field and the Green for us to remind everyone not to leave bits of metal on the grass as these can cause expensive damage to the mower.
