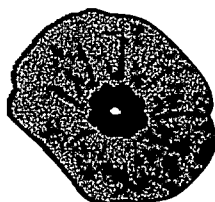

The Parish council met on Wednesday 16th July. Among the issues raised was that of parking, especially in East End, due to the success of the playing field. May we suggest that if any vehicle is inconsiderately parked that the registration number is taken and passed on to PCSO 7145 **Jo Hillery**, the local Community Police Officer who will follow it up. We are also looking into the maintenance and ease of access of the various footpaths surrounding the village.

Tree management is also now becoming an increasing issue for the council. There have been various inspections which have taken place over the last few months and we have, sadly, been advised that two of the lime trees on the edge of the green have been infected with a severe fungus called 'Kretzschmaria deusta' which renders the trees very unstable and for health and safety reasons will have to be felled. The remaining four trees will be pollarded. This will also be followed up by a further inspection in the hope that any infection risk is diminished. We have not taken this decision lightly as we know the significance and the enjoyment the trees bring to the village. However, for the security of the remaining trees and to ensure we do not have a significant incident, we have had to make this decision.

The next council meeting is scheduled for 7.30 pm on Wednesday, September 17th in the village hall. All parishioners are welcome

WE WILL REMEMBER THEM

In our Church we have a Memorial to the fallen of the First World War. Many of us have cleaned and polished it on a regular basis and once a year, on Remembrance Sunday, their names are read out at the War Memorial in Walgrave. But they have only ever been names.

As we arrive at the 100 year anniversary of the outbreak of the First World War perhaps we should find out a little more about the men of our village who gave their lives at such a young age; enlisting and marching off to war, leaving the beautiful countryside of Northamptonshire for the last time. We should also remember the mothers, wives, fiancées, girlfriends, brothers and sisters who were left behind by the men who died in that awful time – their lives never to be the same again.

The information listed below is taken from the 1911 Census and War Records. Scaldwell would have been a very different village then. There was a population of 274 (142 males and 132 Females). The busy quarry on the outskirts of the village and farm work was obviously the main means of employment. Presumably there would have been many small cottages where the farm labourers and ironstone labourers lived with their families.

We lost ten men who marched off to war from this Village and three who had been born in the village but had moved away before the outbreak of war. Hopefully they will now be a little more than a name on a Memorial.

Harry Arthur (Driver). 1st Battalion, Northampton Regiment. Harry was born on the Cold Ashby and moved with his parents to Scaldwell. He was an Under Cowman and lived with his parents Samuel (a Waggoner) and Elizabeth and siblings William, Minnie, Samuel and Jessie at Scaldwell Lodge. Harry died on the 21st March 1916 in Edgbaston Hospital of dysentery contracted when serving in Gallipoli. He is buried in Scaldwell Churchyard. **Age 21**

John Arthur (Private). 1st Battalion, Northampton Regiment. Brother of Harry and again born in Cold Ashby. John was a Groom and lodged with the Sharp Family. He died on the 9th May 1915 and his name appears on the Le Touret Memorial, Nord France. **Age 24**

Walter William Fuller (Private). 1st Battalion, Northampton Regiment. Walter lodged with the Tite Family and was a farm labourer and is buried at Longuenesse (St Omer) Souvenir Cemetery, Pas de Calais. He died on 22nd February 1916. **Age 24**

George Howlett (Private). 5th Battalion, Northampton Regiment. George lived with his parents Edward (Ironstone Labourer) and Mary and siblings Mary Jane, Ernest, Elizabeth and Violet. He was also an Ironstone Labourer. He died of his wounds in Manchester on 22nd September 1916 and is buried in Scaldwell. **Age 31**

Joseph Butler Howlett (Corporal). 2nd Battalion. Northampton Regiment. Brother of George. Joseph was an Ironstone Labourer. He died on the 23rd July 1916 and his name appears on the Thiepval Memorial, Somme. Age 24

Charles Robert Walker (Private). 7th Battalion. Northampton Regiment. Son of Tom (Wagoner on farm) and Annie. His Siblings were Francis, Harry and Edward. He was a farm labourer. He was found dead at a listening post in Flanders on 27th December 1916 and is buried at Kemmel Chateau Military Cemetery, West-Vlaanderen, Belgium. Age 23

Albert George Worth (Lance Corporal) 2nd/4th Battalion, Northampton Regiment. Albert was a farm labourer and son of John (also Farm Labourer) and Sarah. His Siblings were William, Albert and Ellen. John died of Meningitis at Aylesbury 25th October 1916 and is buried in Scaldwell. Age 20

William John Worth (Private) 4th Battalion, Northampton Regiment – Transferred to Northumberland Fusiliers. Brother of Albert George above and a Baker's Assistant. Missing, presumed dead at Ypres. His name appears on the Tyne Cot Memorial, West-Vlaanderen, Belgium. Age 21

Alfred A. Soames, D.S.O. (Major) The Buffs, 6th Battalion. Major Soames lived in Scaldwell House. He was born on the 16th September 1862, the son of Reverend Charles Soames, MA, of Mildenhall, Marlborough, and Wiltshire. He served in the South African War in 1901 where he received the Queen's Medal with a clasp, and was created a Companion of the Distinguished Service Order [London Gazette 31 October 1902]: "Alfred Soames, Lieutenant, South African Mounted Irregular Forces. In recognition of services during the operations in South Africa". Lieutenant Soames served in the Great War with the 6th Battalion East Kent Regiment (The Buffs), and was killed in action 13 October 1915. His name appears on the memorial at Loos-en-Gohelle, Pas de Calais. Age 53

Walter Underwood (Driver). Manchester Regiment. Walter was born in Yardley Hastings and in 1911 lived here Tin House, Brick Cottages, Old Road, and Scaldwell with his parents, David and Ellen, and siblings Arthur, Ada, Frederick, Lizzie, Florence and Ellen. Killed in action on 5th November 1918. Age 19.

Frederick K. Smart (Harry). Harry was born in Holloway London and was an Ironstone Labourer. He had a wife, Annie and three children, Harry aged 14, Ethel aged 12 and William aged 9. Age 39

As mentioned above three other men, who were born in Scaldwell, were killed in action but by the time of the commencement of the war they had moved away:-

Thomas Hamson. (Private) 7th Battalion, Royal Sussex Regiment. Resident of Northampton. Killed in action on the 8th August 1918.

Charles Henry Stiff (Private) 2nd Battalion, Leicestershire Regiment. Died of wounds when with the British Expeditionary Force.

John A. Sharpe (Private). 2/8th Battalion, Sherwood Foresters (Notts and Derbyshire Regiment)
