Heavy Lorries

The County Council have been given further statistics to support our petition for a 7.5 tonnes weight restriction to be imposed on the road through the village. They have been asked also to take into account two further factors:-

- (1) An announcement on local radio that the Cherry Hill Depot has been sold to a shipping company who are likely to increase activity at the depot.
- (2) The new Brixworth By Pass will be routed on our side of the A508 with a roundabout feeding Scaldwell on our side of the amenity tip; this will encourage more traffic to branch off through Scaldwell.

VILLAGE OUTING
