PARISH COUNCIL

STREET LIGHTS We have now obtained a loan from the Public Works Loan Board, & our street lighting modernisation & repair work have been put into the Electricity Board's programme of work. We hope that the new lighting will be installed before the winter.

HEAVY LORRIES- PLANNING APPLICATION, CHERRY HILL DEPOT.

Knights of Old have applied for planning permission to redevelop the Cherry Hill site as a hamlet with a minimum of 60 houses. The money obtained by selling the depot for residential building would help them to move to a new location in Kettering & to compensate for some of the business they would lose, as they could not, by law, store there some of the chemicals they handle at present. This is a great opportunity for Scaldwell & its neighbour villages to reduce the dangers caused by heavy lorries passing through, especially the dangers to our children. The Parish Council has sent a letter to the District Council strongly supporting the application.

BOUNDARY CHANGES At a meeting attended by representatives from Scaldwell, Holcot, Old, Walgrave & Hannington & by Roger Freeman M.P, it was decided unanimously not to proceed with an application to Kettering. In addition to the reservations of some Scaldwell villagers, telling arguments were advanced, & it was clear that those present at the meeting all favoured remaining with Daventry District Council.
